This funding opportunity will award assessment grants to develop inventories of brownfield sites, prioritize sites, conduct community involvement activities, conduct planning, conduct site assessments, develop site-specific cleanup plans, and develop reuse plans.

Description: A CSB Rebate is a payment from the EPA to an eligible entity to subsidize the purchase of a zero emission (ZE) or clean school bus, eligible infrastructure, and other costs, including workforce training, that meet the requirements described in this Program Guide.

Eligible Applicants: Public school districts: local or state governmental entities responsible for providing school bus, or the purchase, lease, license, or contract for service of school buses; a Regional Education Service Agency (RESA); Tribal Applicants, others. Coming Soon

- The DOT has a <u>running list of anticipated dates</u> for upcoming NOFO's.
 - Promoting Resilient Operations for Transformative, Efficient, and Cost-saving <u>Transportation (PROTECT)</u> -- The next NOFO is expected to be announced in October 2024.
 - Local and Regional Project Assistance Grants (RAISE) -- The FY 2025 NOFO is expected to be released in November 2024
 - Safe Streets and Roads for All (SS4A) -- The FY 2025 NOFO is expected to be released in early 2025, and by statute must be released on or before March 30, 2025.
 - Port Infrastructure Development Program (PIDP) -- next NOFO is expected to be announced in December 2024.
