When do I need to file my federal and state taxes?

On March 21, the Treasury Department and Internal Revenue Service <u>delayed</u> the federal income tax filing due date from April 15, 2020, to July 15, 2020.

All taxpayers – individuals, trusts and estates, corporations, and other non-corporate tax filers, and those who pay self-employment tax – can also defer federal income tax payments due on April 15, 2020, to July 15, 2020, without being penalized or paying interest.

This relief automatically applies to taxpayers, meaning no additional forms are required to qualify for the extension.

Individual taxpayers can request a filing extension beyond the July 15 deadline by filing Form 4868 through a tax professional, tax software, or using the <u>IRS's Free File</u> tool. Businesses interested in an extension must file Form 7004.

Taxpayers seeking a refund should file as soon as possible. The IRS states that it is issuing most tax refunds within 21 days. Check the status of your refund <u>here</u>.
